Conference FAQs

General Information

Q: When and where is the conference taking place?

A: The conference will be held on 26th – 28th of September at East Midlands Conference Centre, Beeston Ln, Nottingham, Beeston NG7 2RJ.

Q: Who can attend the conference?

A: The conference is open to all members of the SMA community, as well as professionals in the field. Day tickets are available for Community members and professionals that wish to attend and participate in the event.

Q: Can I book more than one room through SMA UK?

A: Rooms are limited; therefore, to ensure as many members of the SMA community as possible can attend, you may only book up to two rooms per family group. Bookings are for immediate family only through SMA UK.

Q: How many people can this ticket accommodate?

A: This ticket will accommodate up to two adults (in either a double or twin bed), plus, if required, up to one child and one additional child under 5 in a travel cot. If you have older children, you will need to book two rooms

Q: Is there a dress code for the conference?

A: The dress code is casual.

Q: How do I register for the conference?

Q: Can I get a refund if I can't attend?

A: Tickets are non-refundable and non-transferable. In the event of cancellation due to unforeseen circumstances (e.g., severe weather, venue closure, government restrictions), the organiser reserves the right to reschedule the event or provide an alternative arrangement. If rescheduling is not possible, ticket holders will be offered a refund.

Q: Can I transfer my ticket to someone else if I can't attend?

A: No, tickets are non-transferable. If you cannot attend, please contact us for further guidance.

Q: Can I purchase a ticket at the door?

A: No, all tickets must be purchased in advance.

Q: Are group discounts available for tickets?

A: We don't offer group discounts on registrations; however, your ticket will include:

- Accommodation for up to two adults (in either a double or twin bed).
- One child and an additional child under five in a travel cot (if required).
- One allocated room per group.

A: We won't be providing formal childcare, but a room with soft play and other activities will be available. A parent must be present with the child at all times in this space. Parents remain fully responsible for all their children at all times and must be aware of their whereabouts.

Travel & Accommodation

Q: Are there hotels nearby?

A: Yes, accommodation is available both on-site and at nearby hotels.

If you book through us, you will stay at **The Orchard Hotel**, which is located at the East Midlands Conference Centre.

Q: How do I get to the venue?

- **By road**: East Midlands Conference Centre is off the M1, JCT 25, 3 miles from Nottingham (Postcode NG7 2RJ).
- **By rail**: Nottingham railway station is 4 miles away. The nearest tram stop is University Boulevard, a 10-minute walk away.
- By air:
 - East Midlands Airport: 14 miles, 20 mins by car.
 - o Birmingham Airport: 50 miles, 90 mins by car.
- Parking: Free on-site parking & electric charging points There are 4 electric charging bays in the car park, three of which are specifically for Tesla vehicles.

Q: Can I extend my stay at the conference hotel?

A: Yes, but depending on availability with the venue. additional nights must be booked separately through the hotel.

Q: Is financial assistance available for travel?

Accessibility

Q: Is the venue wheelchair accessible?

A: Yes, the venue is fully wheelchair accessible, with step-free access, accessible restrooms, and elevators. The dimensions of the lift are 120cm x 132cm (3ft 11in x 4ft 4in). The internal controls for the lift are within 90cm - 120cm from the floor, and the weight limit for the lift is 800kg.

Q: Will there be a changing room toilet on-site?

A: Yes, there are five accessible bathrooms at the hotel, and a Mobiloo will also be available. Additional changing facilities are at the swimming pool.

Q: Will a mobile hoist be available for the community to use?

A: Yes, we will have some communal mobile hoists available for community members to use on each floor. However, you are more than welcome to bring your own equipment.

Q: How many power supplies are available in a room for medical purposes?

A: All rooms will have power outlets available; however, if you need to power more than two devices, we recommend bringing your own extension cord to ensure you have enough access points.

Q: Will there be tables in the room for BiPAPs and other respiratory equipment?

A: Yes, each room has small tables, along with a larger table for refreshments. The larger table can be moved around to accommodate your needs.

Q: Will there be accessible seating available?

A: Yes, accessible seating will be available throughout the event. Please let us know in advance if you have specific seating needs.

Q: Will sign language interpreters or other accessibility services be provided?

A: If you require a BSL interpreter or other accommodations, please contact gary.edgecombe@smauk.org.uk in advance.

Q: Is there a quiet room available?

A: Yes, a quiet space will be available for attendees who need a break from the event. Carers and PAs can also use this space.

Q: Will there be a private space for medical interventions?

A: Yes, a designated private space will be available. Our team will be available to assist with any questions on the day.

Q: Are service animals allowed?

A: Yes, registered service animals are welcome. Please let us know in advance if you will be bringing one.

Q: Will there be accessible transport options from the airport or train station?

A: We are exploring accessible transport options. Please check our website for updates or contact us if you require assistance.

Food & Refreshments

Q: Are meals included in my ticket?

A: Yes, meals and refreshments are included. Tea and coffee refreshments will be available upon arrival, as well as at 11:30 AM and 3:00 PM on both days. A hot and cold buffet will be served between 1:00–2:00 PM for all attendees. Please check the event schedule for more food and refreshment updates. If you would like to arrange a soft meal alternative or have any dietary requirements, please let us know in advance.

Q: Can I bring my own food?

A: Yes, you are welcome to bring personal food items, particularly if you have medical or dietary requirements. Please inform us in advance so we can update our records accordingly.

Q: Will there be vegetarian, vegan, or allergen-free food options?

A: Yes, we will offer a variety of meal options, including vegetarian, vegan, and allergenfree choices. Please specify dietary requirements when registering.
